A copy of the Accountant's Compilation Report is also available for viewing at the Association office.

I am also pleased to report that after the first four months of 2017 we are operating right at our total budget.

Our cash position remains solid. Our cash position as of April 30th is:

Cash	TY \$640,568.79	LY \$645,123.11
Reserve Funds	TY \$197,084.74	LY \$205,832.56
Total	TY \$825,535.87	LY \$847,506.46

Although the above totals show \$21,970.59 less cash on hand than last year, the first phase of the 2017 repaving work was completed in April at a cost of \$45,033.00. We did not complete last year's repaving until May. Adjusting for the timing of the repaving expenditure for the two years, our cash position is actually \$23,062.41 higher than last year. For the second year in a row, we can thank another mild winter for our early cash savings.

We have begun work on our 2018 budget.

Finally, I want to thank the other directors and our truly dedicated employees for their contributions to making 2016 financially successful.

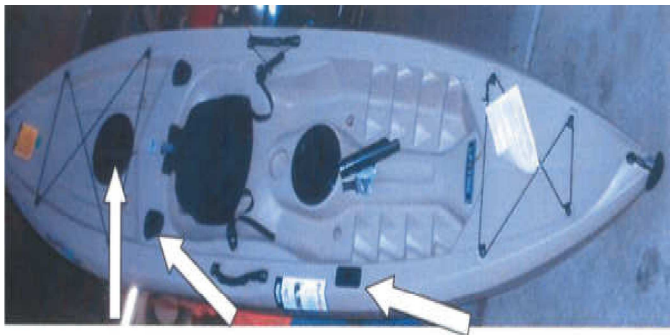

MAINTENANCE

Our excellent maintenance crew, along with our fine outside contractors have been busy getting Shadow Lakes ready for our summer season.

In the last issue I told you of the major re-grading of our nature trail last fall. After a mild but wet winter and early spring we did additional grading and added another 120 tons of road mix to the trail. This was in addition to the same amount added last fall for a total of over 240 tons. Enjoy the trail!

Speaking of tonnage, we added 120 tons of sand to our beach and 15 tons to the volley ball court. (Check out a short video on our web site showing Joe and John spreading the sand using our own equipment)

This year's paving has been completed on schedule along with the seal coating and striping of the Amenity Center parking lot. Sunfish Circle, Walleye Lane and a section of Largemouth Lane were done in Fisherman's Village. Two sections of Fossil Cove Lane were completed along with the repair of a section of Birch Lane. Finally, a pad that will help to conserve our road salt, road cold patch and other materials was put down in our maintenance area.

The pool has a fresh new coat of paint, a new chlorinator and new drain safety covers were installed in time for the opening on May 27th.

In our continuing efforts to reduce costs wherever possible we have installed four new water saving flushometer toilets in the Amenity Center. The new toilets use only 1.6 gallons per flush replacing the old models that used nearly 4 gallons per flush. Our conservative estimate is an annual usage savings of 90,000 gallons or around \$500.00 per year at our current water rates.

REMINDER...With the opening of the pool, we will no longer be burning yard waste. Mulching of grass and leaves is not only good for your lawn it also helps reduce the cost of hauling away the yard waste. We are still having members drop off un-bundled branches and small trees. Please review our guidelines regarding yard waste.

The weed boat began its work mid-May and will continue thru the summer.

Our maintenance staff takes great pride in keeping Shadow Lakes running smoothly as and maintaining our common areas. As you see them performing these very important duties, why not take a moment to thank them for all that they do every day of the year.

SECURITY/ARCHITECTURE

Weeds:

A season long test is underway in Fisherman's Village to test the effectiveness and cost efficiency of chemical weed treatment. Rollins Aquatics will be on property in the test channel to treat overpopulated or undesirable weeds and algae. Feel free to view the results yourself. The Board will be looking at results in order to make a decision on treating more channels next year.

Safety:

We have 2 new resident employees in our Safety & Compliance department. Don Stifter has started working the compliance responsibilities addressing property maintenance and appearance issues as well as golf cart and boat permitting (due soon!). POAC members will be assisting him in all the villages by pointing out repairs or clean-up issues that need to be addressed. Miriam Lardenas has been active for over 1 month on security detail. We're glad to have both of them on board.

It seems we have more safety problems with uncontrolled guests than residents. Please understand that, as property owners, you are the one responsible for your guests and you are the one who will be responsible for any fines they incur. Make sure they understand our rules.

Look for our portable radar speed sign to show up in your area. This is on loan from the City of Braidwood. If you notice someone speeding and the radar confirms it, please report the car/golf cart, lot number and 'flashing' speed (from the sign) to the office. We will keep a record of it and issue a fine if appropriate.

The NO scrubbing aspect of this product can reduce this problem for up to 2 years. Look for your reps with the squirt bottles.

SUMMER UPDATE

2017 Fishing Season Report: it started off with a big bang! Mid-March to Mid-April saw some of our best Crappie and Walleye fishing in years. Reports of schooling Crappies in 5 or 6 different year growths. Many Crappie were 12 to 14 inches. Some boats catching up to 100 Crappie, keeping only a few fish. Gulp Alive and live minnows worked, but the Gulp baits out-fished the live bait. Reported Walleyes up to 24 inches were caught.

Then, the Bass fishing kicked off, we had over 20 Largemouth Bass reported between 19 and 23 inches. Some pictures will be in our newsletter. The bass were on their beds and would strike live baits or Jig & Pig Crayfish offerings. We expect a great fishing Season. The Bass, Crappie and Walleye (a 24 inch) were all very healthy fish. Also, a Musky close to 40 inches was reported. Schools of baitfish are abundant. After the spawning season, we will see the if “Wacky Worm” and other rubber worm baits become popular.

Our Spring stocking has been completed with Red-ear, Spawner Gills, large Perch, Catfish and almost 800,000 forage (minnows). Our Fall stocking will include more forage, Walleyes Crappies and Trout.

Our first Summer event will be June 3rd “Family Panfish Derby” with family trophy and a hot dog lunch. This event is free and open to any and all resident families. Details and sign-up sheet on the Fishing Club bulletin board in the Amenity Center.

The Club meets every third Sunday at 9 AM in the Amenity Center, free coffee, Danish and a tackle raffle. Our 1 hour meetings are fun and informative. Please join us! Applications are in the Association Office.

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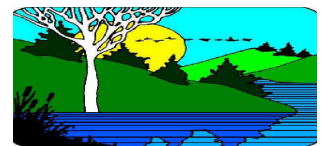
